

SERVICE NOTES FOR THIS EVENING

Vespers is a Daily Office, different from a Divine Service. There is no communion, and the parts of the liturgy focus on the workings of God during particular hours of the day rather than seasons of the year. It has been customary in the church for over a thousand years to use Vespers services, particularly in Advent and Lent, as times of Catechesis and prayer. In the Lutheran Church, then it is good and right to meditate on parts of the Catechism during these seasons. This year, we will look at the Ten Commandments from Exodus 20.

FIRST LESSON Exodus 3:1-8a, 11-14

^{3:1} Now Moses was shepherding the flock of Jethro, his father-in-law, a priest of Midian, and he led the flock to the far side of the wilderness and came to Horeb, the mountain of God. ²The Angel of the LORD appeared to him in blazing fire from within a bush. Moses saw that the bush was on fire, but the bush was not burning up. 3So he said, "I will go over and look at this amazing sight—to find out why the bush is not burning up." 4When the LORD saw that Moses had gone over to take a look. God called to him from the middle of the bush and said. "Moses! Moses!" Moses said. "I am here." 5The Lord said. "Do not come any closer. Take your sandals off your feet, for the place where you are standing is holy ground." ⁶He then said, "I am the God of your fathers, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob." Moses hid his face, because he was afraid to look at God. ⁷The LORD said, "I have certainly seen the misery of my people in Egypt, and I have heard their cry for help because of their slave drivers. Yes, I am aware of their suffering. 8So I have come down to deliver them... ¹¹But Moses said to God, "Who am I, that I should go to Pharaoh, and that I should bring the Israelites out of Egypt?" ¹²So he said, "I WILL certainly be with you. This will be the sign to you that I have sent you: When you have brought the people out of Egypt, you will serve God on this mountain." ¹³But Moses said to God, "If I go to the Israelites and say to them, 'The God of your fathers has sent me to you,' and they ask me, 'What is his name?' what should I say to them?" ¹⁴So God replied to Moses, "I AM who I AM." He also said, "You will say this to the Israelites: I AM has sent me to vou."

GOSPEL John 7:11-19; 8:12

"Where is he?" ¹²And there was widespread whispering about him in the crowds. Some were saying, "He's a good man." Others were saying, "No, he deceives the people." ¹³Yet no one spoke openly about him for fear of the Jews.

¹⁴When the festival was already half over, Jesus went up to the temple courts and began to teach. ¹⁵The Jews were amazed and asked, "How does this man know what is written without being instructed?"

¹⁶Jesus answered them, "My teaching is not mine, but it comes from him who sent me. ¹⁷If anyone wants to do his will, he will know whether my teaching is from God or if I speak on my own. ¹⁸The one who speaks on his own is seeking his own glory. But he who seeks the glory of the one who sent him—that is the one who is true, and there is no unrighteousness in him. ¹⁹Didn't Moses give you the law? Yet none of you does what the law tells you. Why are you trying to kill me?" ⁸⁻¹²When Jesus spoke to them again, he said, "I AM the Light of the World.

Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life."
