Catechesis and Confirmation.

Small Catechism, preface, 6:

"Therefore, I beg you all for God's sake, my dear sirs and brethren, who are pastors or preachers, to devote yourselves heartily to your office [1 Timothy 4:13]. Have pity on the people who are entrusted to you [Acts 20:28] and help us teach the catechism to the people, and especially to the young. And let those of you who cannot do better take these tables and forms and impress them, word for word, on the people [Deuteronomy 6:7].

Large Catechism, longer preface, 7:

But for myself I say this: I am also a doctor and preacher...Yet I act as a child who is being taught the catechism. Every morning—and whenever I have time—I read and say, word for word, the Ten Commandments, the Creed, the Lord's Prayer, the Psalms, and such. I must still read and study them daily. Yet I cannot master the catechism as I wish. But I must remain a child and pupil of the catechism, and am glad to remain so.

'Catechesis' means...

Historically, this looked like...

Cf... Psalm 78 – Telling to the generation to come the praises of the Lord Titus 2:1-8 – Older men teaching young men; older women teaching young women; young men and women teaching their children Ephesians 6:4; Colossians 3:21 – Fathers instructing their children Acts 2:38-47 – Entire households coming together, "sharing all things in common," and continuing "steadfastly in the apostles' doctrine and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in prayers."

'Confirmation' means...

What does this look like?

Deuteronomy 5:1-10, 23-24 - "You shall have no other gods"

Deuteronomy 6:1-15, 20-25 - "Teach...these words"

Large Catechism, preface, 10:

"Besides, catechism study is a most effective help against the devil, the world, the flesh, and all evil thoughts. It helps to be occupied with God's Word, to speak it, and meditate on it, just as the first Psalm declares people blessed who meditate on God's Law day and night (Psalm 1:2). Certainly you will not release a stronger incense or other repellant against the devil than to be engaged by God's commandments and words, and speak, sing, or think them (Colossians 3:16)."

The 'Enchiridion' refers to the... 'Enchiridion' means...

"The Small Catechism...In the plain form in which the **head of the family** shall **teach them** to his household."

How? Begin with <u>short</u> daily devotions using the stories/words from Scripture. Have a set **place** and set **time**. This is your family altar. Use it to worship. Every story teaches the catechism. The Catechism unfolds every story.
